


CREATE A SENSE OF BELONGING

STRONGER TOGETHER

Since its inception, ARTogether has firmly believed in the power of partnership and collaboration, rather than competition, as the cornerstone of its work. As the only art organization in the Bay Area dedicated to serving refugees and immigrants, ARTogether actively partners with government bodies, educational institutes, resettlement agencies, and various social service organizations. This collaborative approach has significantly broadened our reach and impact, allowing us to extend our services to a wider community. In 2023, some of our key partners included the Center for Empowering Refugees and Immigrants, Refugee and Immigrant Transition, International Rescue Committee, East Bay Refugee and Immigrant Forum, City of Oakland Cultural Funding Program, Alameda County Art Commissioners, Oakland International High School, Fremont High School, Oakland Vietnamese Chamber of Commerce, Oakland Chinatown Coalition, Kaimera Productions, Asian Health Services, and others. 




